From our Minister - Revd David Jebb

Dear Friends

One of the deepest convictions of the Easter story is this: Christ is Risen - He is risen indeed. Alleluia! This truth brings us a message of unlimited grace, victory, joy and hope, for in His resurrection, Jesus triumphed over death.

In Shakespeare's *Hamlet*, death is described as "the undiscovered country from whose bourn no traveller returns." Yet for Christians, that is not the end - Jesus, the Christ, returned, affirming that death is not the final chapter.



Had Jesus' story ended with the crucifixion, He might have been remembered merely as an inspirational teacher, a charismatic figure, or even a martyr. Instead, His victory over death, rising from the grave on the third day, transforms our understanding of life and promises us resurrection. We are a people of the resurrection because we know that Easter



is inseparable from the sacrifice of Good Friday. We cannot have Christ without the cross - a symbol of a compassionate, loving God who identifies with human suffering and uses it as an instrument of salvation. No other faith speaks so clearly of a suffering God who stands against injustice and oppression.

Throughout history, God has worked through human beings - the very signets of His creation - to continue the healing and transforming ministry of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ. It is my sincere prayer that, in this Easter season, we all come to know the hope, joy, and peace that the resurrection brings.

A big thank you to everyone who helped with the Jumble Sale on Saturday 8 March. The hard work was much appreciated and helped to raise a massive £1,550!














March Parade Service

He reminded us how St John's has grown over the years yet kept its focus on welcoming and nurturing all those who come along. He said he and his wife Michele were warmly welcomed the first time they came to a service which was very soon after they were married and had just moved to Potters Bar. He then interviewed two members - Pat Griffith and David Rhodes about what drew them to coming along to St John's too. Alan and Michele's two daughters - Emma and Rachel, also joined us for the service.



Christmas Charity – Noah's Ark Children's Hospice



This year we chose Noah's Ark Children's Hospice as our Christmas charity. We raised £2,479.72 for the good cause and received this lovely letter from them;

Dear all at St John's Methodist Church

On behalf of all of us here at Noah's Ark, I am writing to say thank you so much to the parish of St John's Methodist for your incredibly generous donation of £2,479.72, raised through your Christmas Collection - we are very grateful for your support.

As you know Noah's Ark Children's Hospice cares for babies, children and young people who are seriously unwell, and their families. We know that every moment together is precious to our families and we want to make sure these moments count. For Katie and Tom, Noah's Ark were there from the moment they received the news that their daughter Leia may only have a few months to live. The family now access most of the services at The Ark, receiving music therapy and overnight respite care which is very important for the family as it's the only place they can leave Leia, safe in the knowledge that our expert team are on hand as she is PEG fed, has serious epilepsy and is profoundly disabled. Katie says of her visit to The Ark: "Here we were in a place with smiling faces, cups of tea, bright and accessible rooms for children to be children, I was so grateful this place existed to support us ." The family also receive support from Specialist Carer, Alice, with whom Leia has developed a very special bond. "When Alice either comes to our house or the hospital or we bring Leia here to The Ark, we know Leia is very safe, that she is very loved and that she will do everything to make Leia happy." Katie realises that her initial ideas of what Noah's Ark Children's Hospice would be like were very different to the reality. She adds: "A children's hospice is a place for children to live. It's a place where memories are made and where you feel supported. It's about making the most of the life that you have, even if it's not as long a life as the average person."

It costs around £18, 000 a day for us to be there for those who need us most, with around 83% of our funding from voluntary donations. It is only thanks to the support of our community that we can keep being there for children like Leia and their families. Thank you so much for helping us to be there for families such as Leia's. We couldn't do it without you!
