## The Power of Remembering

Each year, on Remembrance Sunday, we come together in reverence and gratitude to honour the brave men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of peace, justice, and freedom. It is a day not only of sombre reflection, but also of deep gratitude for those who fought and gave their lives so that we may enjoy the freedoms we cherish today.

From a Christian perspective, this act of remembrance holds profound significance. Throughout the Bible, God repeatedly calls His people to remember - whether it's recalling His

We're now halfway through our 2nd Alpha Course, and it's going great! We have 15 participants and 5 helpers, and everything is running smoothly. There's a real sense of excitement as people engage with Alpha on Tuesdays, which is incredibly encouraging. One of our previous Alpha participants, Jenny, recently reflected on her first experience with us last year. Jenny writes....

#### Going Back to Basics: My Alpha Journey

Alpha helped me reconnect with the core aspects of my faith – Jesus' life and teachings, the power of prayer, and the importance of the Bible. It was like reuniting with an old friend and discovering new depth in our relationship. This journey reignitedmy passion for what I believe.

#### **Personal Growth**

Alpha pushed me to pray with more intention, read the Bible with fresh eyes, and actively live out Christ's teachings. This growth brought about real transformation in my daily life.

#### **Community and Connection**

Sharing this experience with others was truly uplifting. Discussing questions, sharing stories, and building friendships with fellow participants gave me so much encouragement and strength in my spiritual journey.

#### **A Welcoming Space**

Alpha provided a safe space for me to ask questions and wrestle with doubts. I learned that these aren't signs of weak faith but opportunities for growth and understanding.

#### Deepening My Relationship with God

Through Alpha, I felt a renewed connection with God. My prayer life became more meaningful, and I felt His presence in my everyday life. I realised that faith is an ongoing journey, and God welcomes us as we are.

#### **Sharing My Faith**

Alpha gave me the tools and confidence to share my faith with others. In a world that can feel uncertain, being able to offer hope and light through God's Word feels more important than ever.

Hearing this kind of feedback is a beautiful reminder of the impact Alpha can have on people.

## A message from our Treasurer

As many of you will be aware the work of our circuit ministers and the maintenance of our buildings here at St John's are supported financially by the generous regular giving of many of our members and friends.

As many of these costs rise year on year, I invite our regular contributors to review their giving and, if they feel able to do so, to consider increasing it.

Also, newer members may wish to join our regular giving schemes to support the work of the church. An advantage of doing this is that the Church can reclaim Gift Aid on

donations where the donor is a UK taxpayer and pays sufficient Income or Capital Gains Tax.

Our preferred method of giving is now by standing order direct to the Church's bank account. However, for those who prefer more traditional methods, cheque or cash donations can be made using our blue envelopes placed at the back of the Church which have the space to complete a Gift Aid declaration.
